## **Current Pacific saury fishery**


- Pacific saury (*Cololabis saira*) is the target species harvested by Chinese Taipei fishing vessels using the stick-held dip net in the Northwest Pacific Ocean.
- The main fishing season typically begins in July and ends in November.







## Monthly variations of recent fishery data









Each box has the size grade








Fishing port landing in Kaohsiung


#### Monthly variations of size composition






# Spatial distribution of monthly fishery data


#### Catch (mt)

#### Jan-May

 Argentine shortfin squid (*Illex argentinus*) in the Southwest Atlantic Ocean for the first 4 or 5 months of the year.

#### Jun-Dec

- Proceed to harvest neon flying squid or change fishing gear and harvest Pacific saury in the Northwest Pacific Ocean.
- The main fishing season of Pacific saury typically begins in August and ends in November.
